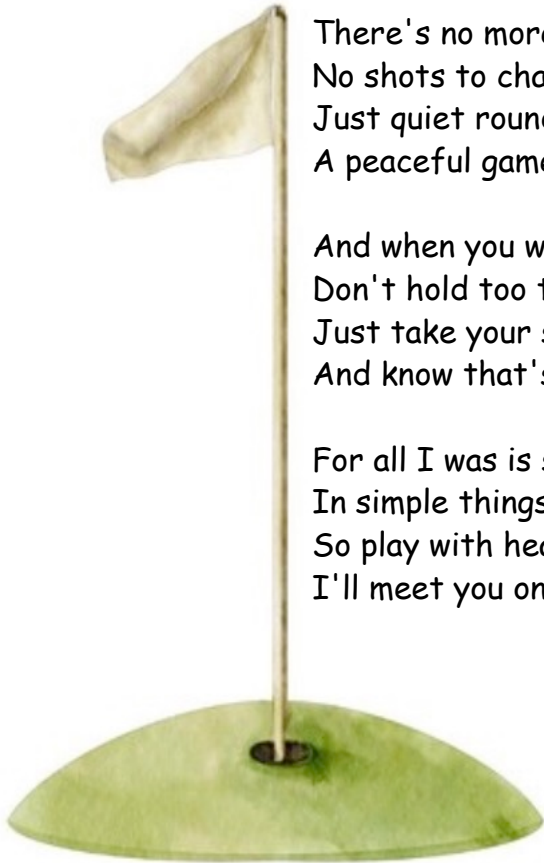
Gone Golfing
