Her sister, Cher, and husband, Dennis, told her to get a passport and Sharon became a world traveler at the age of 69. She was extremely grateful for Cher and Dennis and providing those special and unique experiences that she thought were never possible.

Sharon was a true disciple of Jesus Christ, she loved the gospel, and had a close relationship with her Heavenly Father. Through the many difficult challenges she faced, she sought comfort from her Savior, through prayer and never wavered from her faith.
