Carl met Rosemary in the late nineties. Their love story spanned for over three decades, officially saying "I do" on April 9, 2021. Through their five beautiful years, their bond was built on a lifetime of shared memories, unwavering commitments, and a love that stood the test of time.

He loved to dance, loved to celebrate, and never missed a chance to party with his family and his wife by his side. Those gatherings weren't just events-they were memories in the making. And when the music quieted down, you could find him in a softer moment, reading to his grandchildren, pouring the same love and warmth into their stories that he brought to every dance floor.
