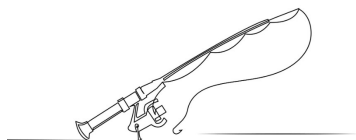

Harold Alvin Kindt was born July 24, 1927 in Rock County, Minnesota to William and Lillian (Lauck) Kindt. He was baptized on January 30, 1928 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Luverne, Minnesota. Harold attended rural Kenneth Country School through the 8th grade. On January 16, 1951, Harold entered the United States Army and served his country during the Korean War.
