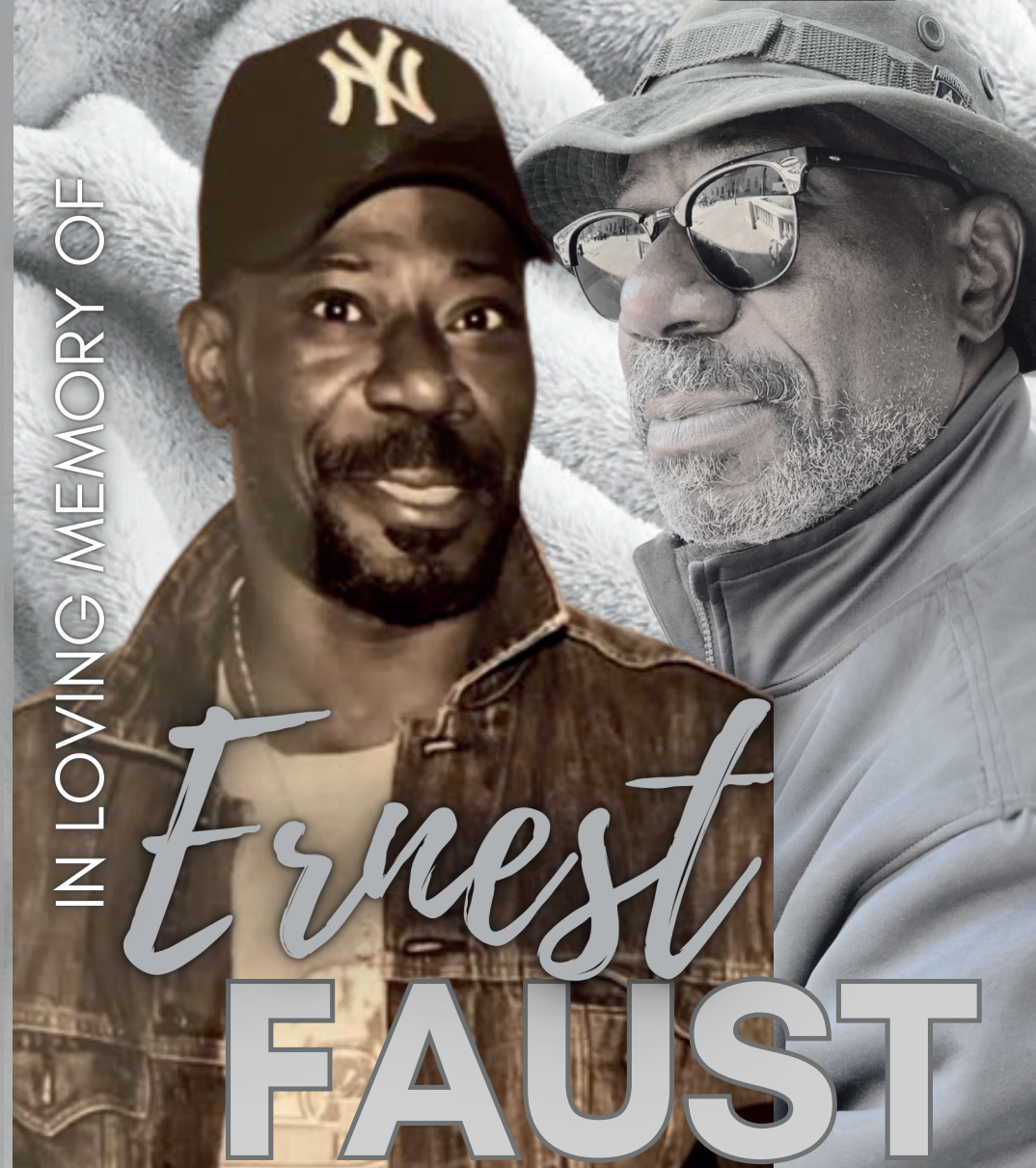

His Story

Ernest (Ernie) Jack Faust was born in Philadelphia, PA, on July 23, 1953, to the late Hattie Mae Faust, formerly of Barnesville, South Carolina. Following the passing of his mother during his birth, Ernie was reared by his maternal grandparents, Duncan and Lumisher Faust, and his aunt, Annie Mae Faust-Harris. He and his older brother, the late Harold Faust, were raised alongside their cousins, Vincent Faust and the late Patricia Ann Faust. They remained as close as siblings, looking out for one another throughout their lives.

Ernie was educated in the Philadelphia public school system and graduated from Overbrook High School in 1970. He later attended Penn State University, where he focused on architectural engineering and competed on the gymnastics team, before attending Lincoln Technical School graduating with a drafting engineering degree. Professionally, Ernie was a certified trainer who worked at World Gym and Rittenhouse Gym. He eventually built a private clientele, forming lasting friendships with many of those he trained. He also enjoyed a long career with the United Parcel Service, from which he retired.

Ernie was a strong biker, an avid reader, an admirer and collector of antiques and a lover of jazz.

Ernie leaves behind to cherish his memory his aunt, Annie Mae, his sister-in-law, Charlotte Faust (Harold) his nephew, Harold Jr. his cousin, Vincent and his children DJ, Vashti, Ahashta and a host of other relatives and friends.
