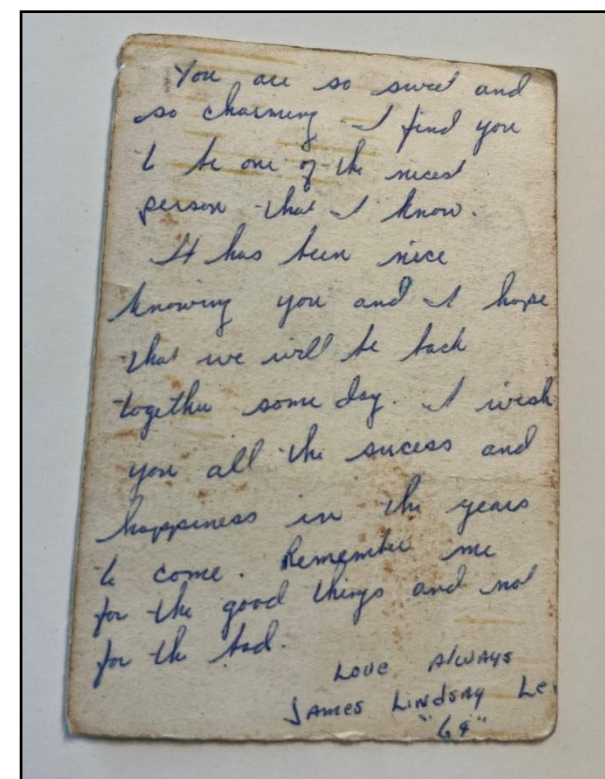
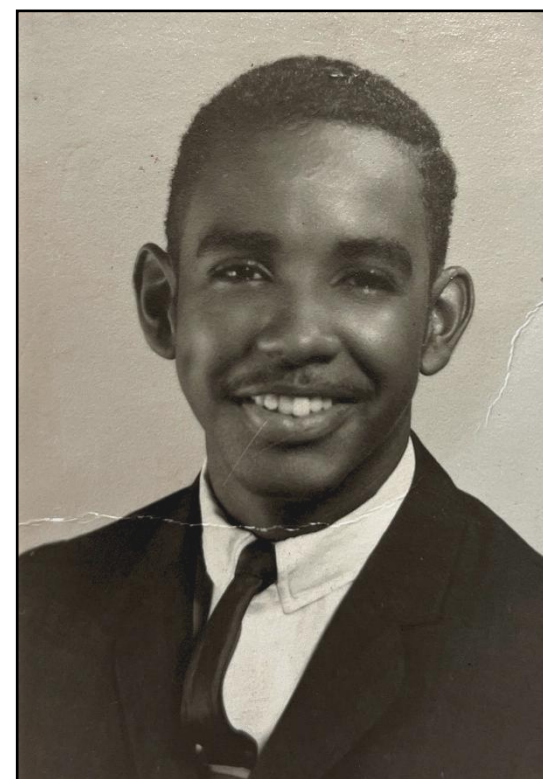


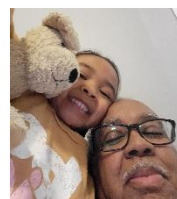
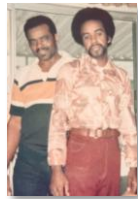
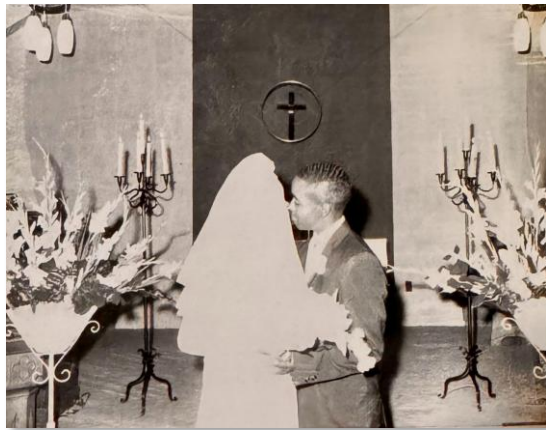
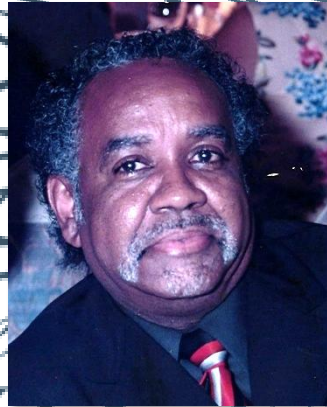
A FINAL BOARDING CALL

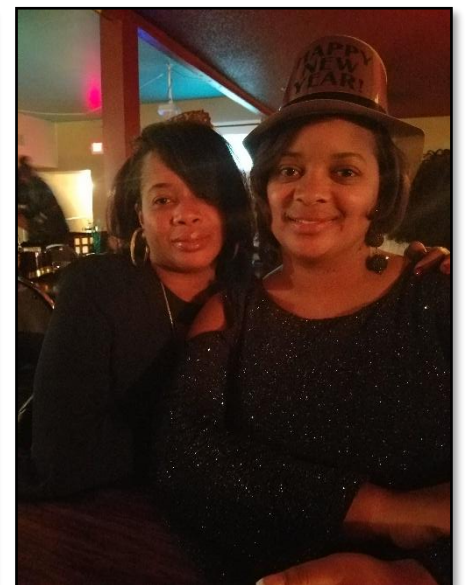
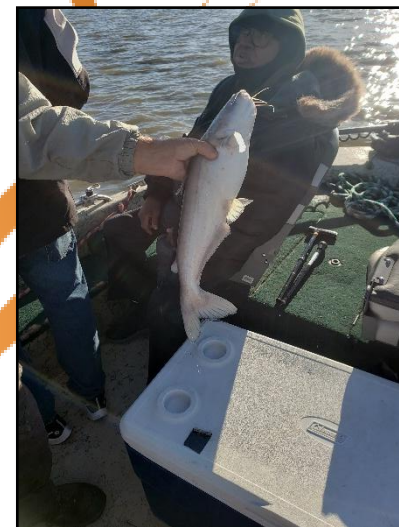
Dear Uncle,
