

## *A Celebration of Life for* **Salathia "Lacey" Blossom Grant**

On May 6, 1984, in Savannah, Georgia, a light entered the world with the birth of Salathia Blossom Grant, lovingly known as Lacey. From the very beginning, she carried a warmth that drew people close and a spirit that made them want to stay. As a child, Lacey was a devoted member of First Metropolitan Missionary Baptist Church, where her faith took root and guided her throughout her life. Quiet by nature, she was gentle and observant, yet when you truly knew her, she would laugh, talk, and share her heart with you. And while she was sweet and warm, she was also direct – if she didn't like what you were saying, she'd let you know, often in a way that mixed honesty with just enough humor to leave you smiling afterward.

She was known for her radiant smile and her big, beautiful eyes, which reflected her gentle soul and brought joy to those around her. Her smile could brighten the darkest day, and her eye revealed a kindness that made others feel seen and loved.

Lacey's proudest role was that of a mother. Her children, Cameron S. Adams and Za'Kiayah D. Grant, were her greatest treasures. She was not only loving but also a fiercely protective mother, ensuring that they were always safe, cared for, and surrounded by love. She poured herself into raising them, leaving behind lessons and memories that will continue to guide them.

Educated in the Chatham County School System, Lacey attended Alfred Ely Beach High School, where she was remembered for her quiet strength, sense of humor, and caring heart. She made friendships that endured, and her warmth left a lasting mark on those who walked alongside her.

She was preceded in death by her beloved Great Great Grandmother Charlotte B. Hamilton, Grandmother Albertha E. Noble, and Grandfather Abraham Scott.



smiling wide for every ache.


A sunny soul, unconditionally, who embraced




*She came fourth, yet her light was strong,
