James Edward Turner, son of the late Preston and Queen Turner, was born on January 2, 1946, in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on September 8, 2022, after a prolonged illness. James, simply known as 'Turner' to his close friends, was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. He graduated from Carver Vocational High School where he learned barbering as a trade and met his lifelong friend, Darryl Powell, who preceded him in death.

Most importantly, he thrived because of her precious devotion to him.

James was preceded in death by his son, Derrick Turner, his parents, his brother, Irvin Turner, and his brother-in-law, James Williams. 


