Leo married Theresa Morgan in 1976. They later divorced, but not before having their first and only child together, a daughter. He later became a father to five more children: four sons and another daughter.

He worked various jobs throughout his life and was working on obtaining his CDL license before he became ill. Leo also worked for the State attorney's office through his employer's contract as a Cleaning Technician and was employed there until his health caused him to stop working and retire.
