Marion Elizabeth (Hoppe) Heuer, passed away on Wednesday, April 1, 2026, surrounded by her family at West Wind Village in Morris, MN. She was 88 years old.

She was baptized November 14, 1937, at Zion Lutheran Church – Horton Township, rural Hancock, MN by Reverend C.W. Ristau where she was then confirmed on Mother's Day, 1951.
