Reverend William H. Cox, was born October 9, 1941 in Anderson SC. He gained his wings Saturday, December 19, 2020. He was the son of the late Charlie and Maude Mattison Cox. He grew up on the Northside of Anderson. His home church was Wilson Calvary Baptist Church, where served as a Deacon for years and was licensed to preach.

Reverend William H. Cox is a 1960 graduate of Westside High School in Anderson SC where he was on the State Championship basketball team. He was later inducted into the Westside's Basketball Hall of Fame. He furthered his education at Friendship Junior College in Rock Hill SC majoring in Liberal Arts. He also studied at the University of South Carolina, Anderson College School of Religion, Toccoa Falls College and Erskine Theological Seminary. He taught school in Anderson School District 5 serving as a coach at McDuffie High School and taught Child Development at Perry School.

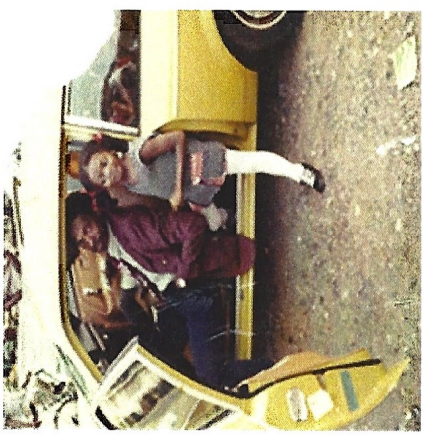
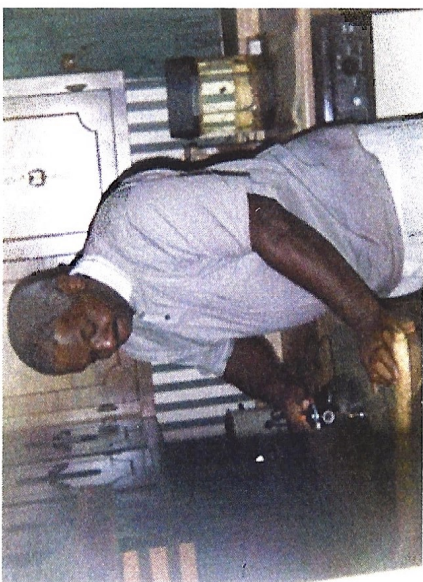
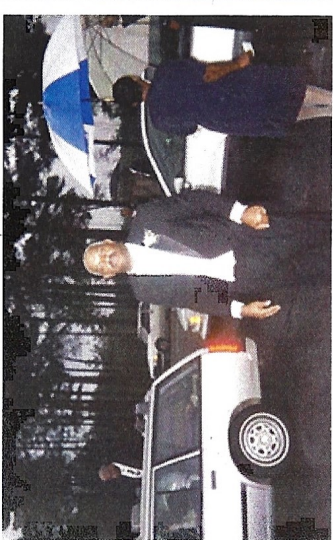
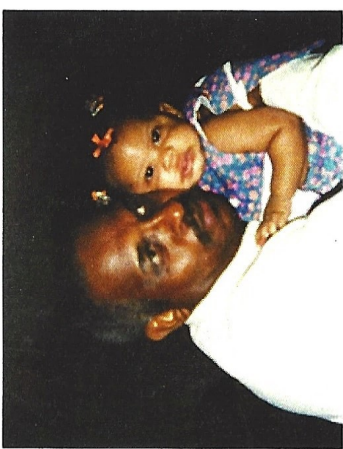
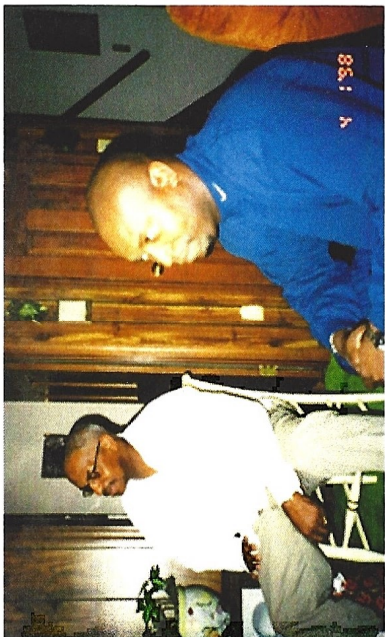

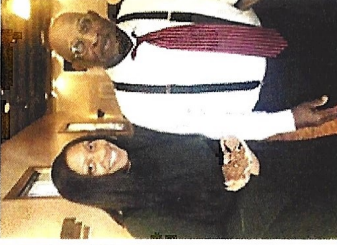
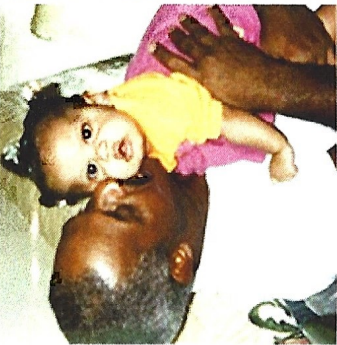
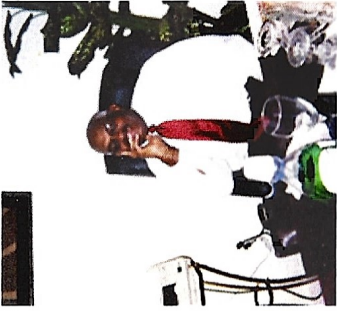
Reverend William H. Cox was a former President and Statistician of the South Carolina Baptist Congress of Christian Education.

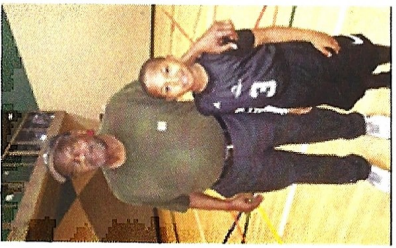
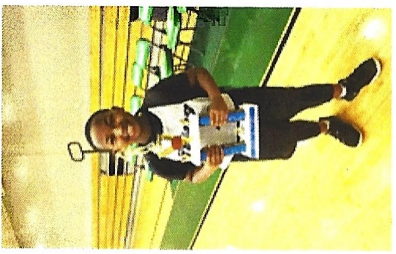
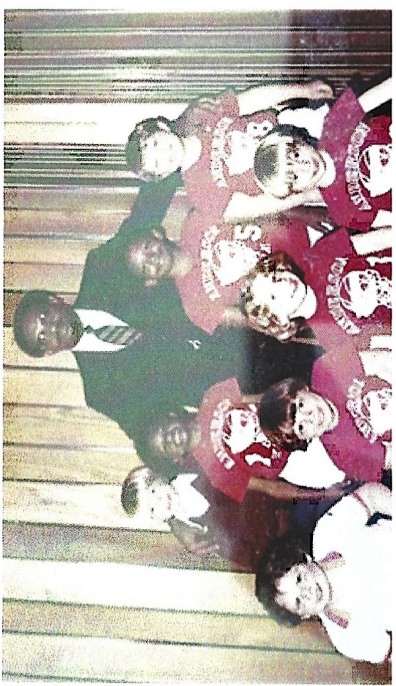
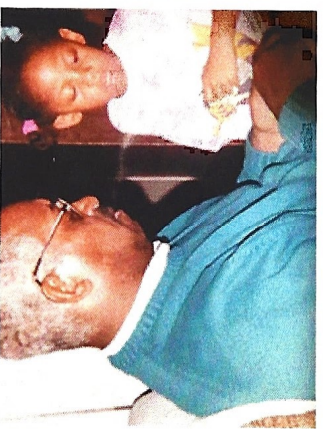
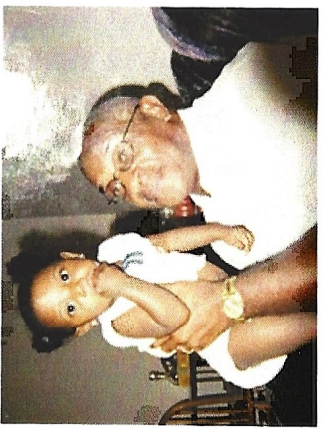
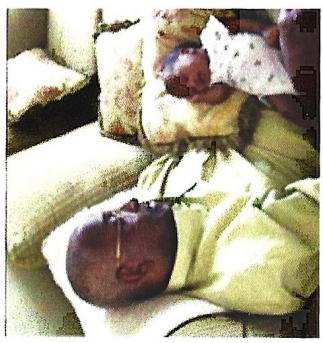
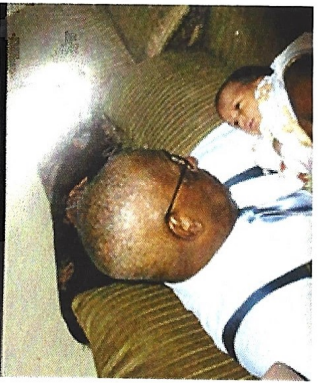
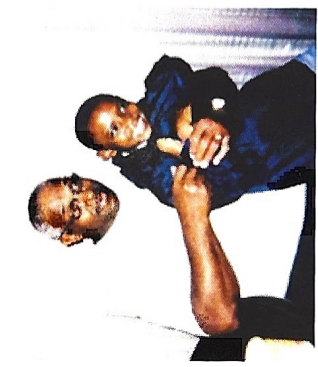
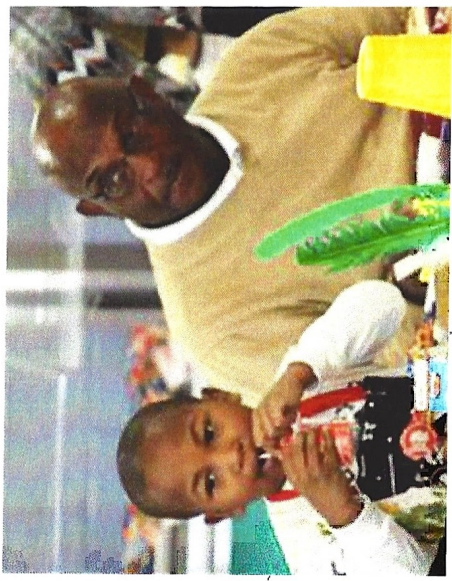
