Katherine Orie Lamons was born to Otis Lamons and Lillie Davis-Lamons, she was born a twin. From this union she had 10 other siblings, older brother Charlie “Buddy Boy” Lamons, A.C Lamons, Freddie Lamons and Paul Henry Lamons. Sister’s Lillie Mae Lamons-Brockington, Ethelrin Lamons-Edwards her twin, 4 other siblings died at birth. Affectionately known as Kat or Lil Sis, called by her family and close friends. Katherine received her education in the Georgia Public School system.

In 1968 she relocated to Boston Massachusetts, seeking a better life and new opportunities to support her son’s Jimmy and Dartha whom she lovingly entrusted to her mother. Katherine joined her brother Freddie and other family members; she chose Boston as her permanent home. She worked for Helping Hands Co., Inc. as a health care aide she dedicated many years to serving the elderly and disabled—cleaning homes, preparing meals, assisting with medical appointments and running errands for them her compassion and work ethics left a lasting impression on all those she helped. In 1975 she gave her life to Jesus Christ and from that moment, she became a vessel of God’s love and power. She was truly anointed used by God to draw her family bring some of her family and many others closer to Jesus Christ.

In the Early 1980’s she joined her cousin Gospel Group Luvenger Booker and the Disciples recording their first album traveling around Boston and neighboring states ministering through song. By the 1990’s, Katherine expanded her calling by starting her street ministry boldly preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ wherever she went. Katherine’s heart was big as her faith, she raised her grandchildren with strength, love, and unwavering devotion. She taught them about Jesus, power of prayer and the importance of church and family. Katherine was a loving caring person always there when you needed her. Katherine’s favorite pastime was cooking especially around the holidays, she loved peanut butter and jelly sandwiches and enjoyed watching her gospel programs and reading her Bible.

Her favorite scripture “I am the way the truth and the life” John 14:6. Sister Katherine was known for her caring nature—always there when someone needed her. A woman of unwavering faith, she prayed for her loved ones and anyone in need reminding them that there is salvation and healing in Christ Jesus. She endured trials and tribulations with grace and unshakable belief. Resting in God’s promises.

Katherine joined Community Revival and Outreach Ministries in the late 1990’s and Community Revival Outreach Ministries Choir she was ordained an Evangelist by Pastor Williams H. Watkins, Sr. her dedication to God was forever fully committed.

Even when she wasn’t feeling at her best, if you asked her how she was doing her response was always with a smile and strong voice “Blessed!” and “God is good all the time and all the time God is good”.
