



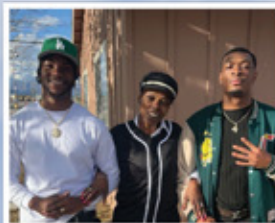

Teresa was big on attending celebrations and loved to dress up and go out to various social events with her sister and very close friends.

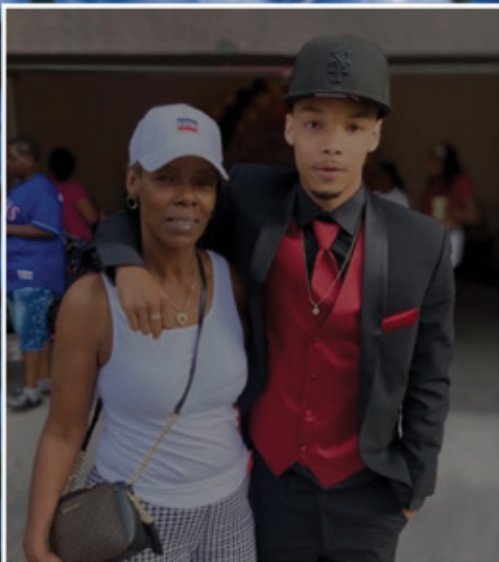
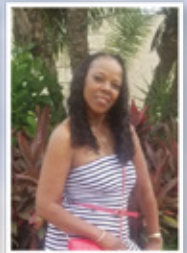
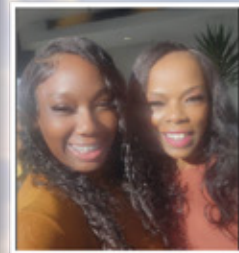
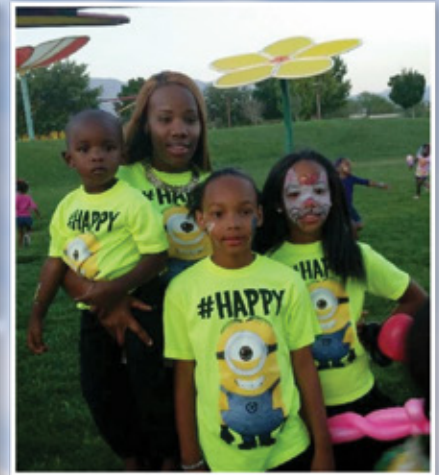
