

He fought a good fight and after for four long months of moving from hospital to hospital, he was able to make it back home to be surrounded by his family and friends. Born in Timmonsville S.C. James attended public school there. He and his family relocated to Baltimore in 1964 where he finished his education by earning his GED. With the desire to go further in life, he enrolled in vocational trade school for plumbing and was ecstatic when he obtained his certification.

While under their teaching he desired more of Jesus, so he studied at the VETI School of Ministry and became indoctrinated with God's Word. Though the ministry changed its name to Baltimore Outreach, their mission remained the same: to reach out and rescue souls of hurting men and women from the intoxicating streets of Baltimore. Before Pastor Joe and Sis. Gloria returned to San Diego, they ordained Pastor Ernesto and Sis. Karen to continue God's work here, and appointed James as Deacon. The ministry again transformed and became Revival of the Heart Family Worship Ministries. An avid lover of God's Word, it was only natural that he would be called to be an instructor. He ministered and taught with passion and conviction. Being a true vessel for God, he also worked tirelessly with the Worship Team, volunteered at the Veterans Hospital, and embodied the Men's Ministry where they met once a month and spent many Sunday and Tuesday evenings studying writing from the book entitled "Kingdom Man". Additionally, James was fully committed and dedicated to the ministry that was dearest to him at "Soldiers Seeking Souls".
