On September 7, 1935, Amanda Ann Conway Seale was born in Dallas, Texas the first of two children to Johnie and Lucile Conway. In January of 1946 the family moved to a farm in south Alvarado, Texas, and it was from Alvarado High School that Amanda completed her formal education. Soon afterward she began working in the Insurance business, working for an insurance company in Fort Worth, Texas, as well as some agencies. Her integrity and business understanding led her to purchase and successfully operate the John Miller Agency in Cleburne, Texas, for many years. She never sought recognition, but her tireless work enriched her community and inspired those around her.

So on the morning of July 24, 2025, she began her reunion with those she loved here who had made that journey before her, including her parents, Johnie and Lucile Conway, her husband, Thomas Carl Seale, and her cherished granddaughter, Mackensie Taylor Seale.
