Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth (Matthew 5:5). Rhonda's teachable, wise, and humble character exemplified the meaning of this scripture. She was a true worshipper who always wanted to give praise to God (Hebrews 13:15). She had an unwavering faith in the Lord and a great love for her family and friends, and she was a beautiful example of the power and benefit of meekness to all who knew her. It is no wonder the hymn, *Amazing Grace*, and the worship song, *Free Worshipper*, were Rhonda's favorites: "Thank God I'm free, and I'll never be bound again!"
