

Joseph Emilcar, beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend, departed this life peacefully on July 2, 2025, in Haines City, Florida, at the age of 71. Born on December 31, 1953, in Aux Cayes, Haiti, Joseph lived a life marked by courage, laughter, love, and sacrifice.

In 1980, with little more than hope and determination, Joseph made the bold decision to immigrate to the United States. The path was not easy, but with unshakable faith and an iron will, he worked tirelessly in the fields, picking produce to provide for the family he loved so dearly. His perseverance opened new doors, leading him to become a proud U.S. citizen and later work at Disney Swan & Dolphin, Westgate Vacation Villas, and Sofidel. After decades of dedication, he joyfully entered into what he called his favorite job—retirement.

His bold spirit and courageous decisions brought him to Haines City, a place he helped shape into a haven for family, friends, and countless members of the Haitian community. Joseph was never one to shy away from sharing wisdom — usually followed by the phrase, “that I said,” a loving reminder that his lessons came from experience and a place of care.

Joseph's true legacy, however, cannot be measured in careers or accomplishments alone. It is written in the hearts of his devoted wife, Marie Claude Emilcar; his cherished children—Sherly, Rose Mirka, Gaskov, Shermiga, Stephanie, Maruth, and Jessen; and his adored grandchildren—Jeremiah, Joshua, Josiah, Daniel, Zenaida, Ryan, Naliah, Ari, Noble, Nyaal, and Avery.

Joseph is survived by his loving siblings—Gereste, Elda, Jean S., Josette, Marie Denis, Clarel, Yvon, Caren, Jean Frenel, and Gladys. He is preceded in death by his parents, Tulia Paul and Precien Emilcar, and his siblings L'Eso, Emilio, Christian, Pistol, Mixene, Jean P., and Evel.

Joseph had a gift for bringing people together—never missing a chance to fire up the stove and feed the ones he loved. From backyard gatherings to holiday meals, he made joy feel like home. He danced off beat, sang along to his favorite music, and cheered passionately for his teams—Brazil, the Orlando Magic, and the LA Lakers—even when his voice was the only one in the room. Through laughter, stories, and soul-warming meals, he created a sense of belonging that will linger in the hearts of many.

A man of deep conviction, Joseph believed in the power of education, often reminding others, “They can take everything but your mind, when you have education on your side.” A fierce advocate for learning and growth, he encouraged every young person he encountered to pursue knowledge and purpose.

Above all, Joseph's life was anchored in his faith. His deep and unwavering love for the Lord was the foundation of everything he did. Whether working long hours, helping others, or gathering his family in prayer, Joseph's heart was always tuned toward God. He believed firmly in the power of prayer, the truth of Scripture, and the grace of salvation through Jesus Christ. His faith was not only spoken—it was lived.

While our hearts ache in his absence, we find comfort in knowing that Joseph Emilcar lived fully, gave generously, and loved deeply. His was a life of honor, laughter, and lasting impact. His spirit lives on in every life he touched—and in every story we continue to tell, with a smile and a tear.
