

Bubba was born on May 17th, 1956, in Taylor, Texas, to Monroe and Lillie Stabeno. He was a graduate of Elgin High School, Class of 1974.

Bubba was united in Holy Matrimony to Vonnie Peel in 1980. The couple lived in Elgin until 2018, moving to Mart, Texas, for retirement. Bubba was a devoted public service employee, where he worked for TXDOT for over 30 years, working on and inspecting bridges.
