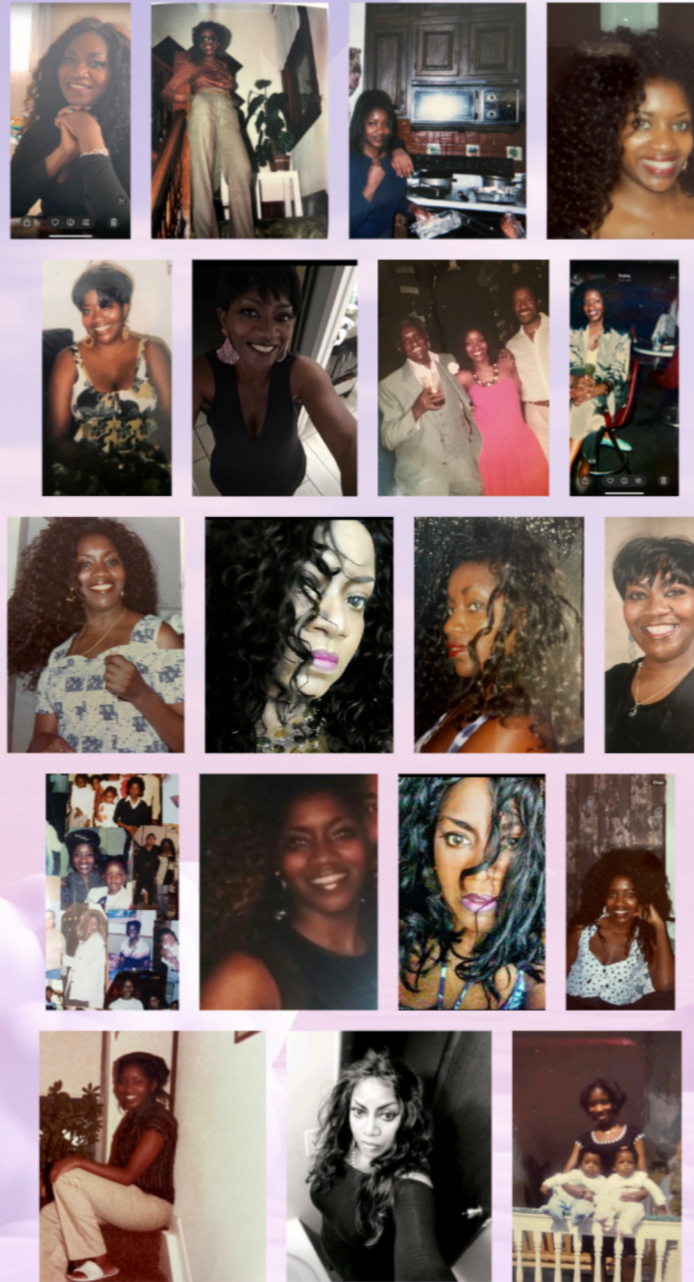
Eunice also worked as a social worker for the City of Cincinnati, but her true calling lay in interior decoration, where she created and built beautiful things in everything she touched.
