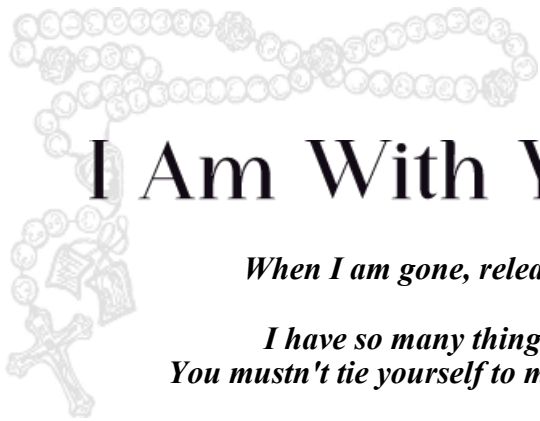




I Am With You Always
