He loved his family deeply, and he took great pride in being a big brother. De'Quan was a young man of many gifts, and each one reflected a different part of who he was. His love for football made him a strong and determined presence on the field, where he played for the Green Valley Giants. His involvement with the Boys & Girls Club showed his community spirit and his willingness to be part of something bigger than himself. His courage was seen not only in sports, but in the way he lived each day—with confidence, curiosity, and heart.
