Brother Timothy James Smith was born on April 14, 1960, in Moncks Corner, South Carolina. He was the beloved son of the late Minister Ezekiel Smith and Elder Elouise Birch Smith. On April 10, 2025, just days before his 65th birthday, Timothy peacefully transitioned into eternal life in North Charleston, SC.

Raised in a loving and faith-filled home, Timothy accepted Christ at an early age and became a devoted member of Canaan Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), where he faithfully served with the choir at one time. He attended church until his health declined. His upbringing shaped the kind, thoughtful, and compassionate man that so many came to know and love.

Timothy was educated in the Berkeley County public school system. After completing his education, he went on to dedicate 33 years of hard work and loyalty as a Longshoreman with the International Longshoremen’s Association (ILA) before retiring. He took great pride in his work and built strong bonds with many along the waterfront.

Those who knew Timothy will remember his warm heart, easygoing spirit, and signature sayings—ranging from his youthful phrase, “You missed the bus,” to his later years' reflection, “It’s hard, but fair.” He had a gentle soul and a giving heart. He was a beacon of kindness and always made time to encourage, uplift, and support others.

Outside of work and family, Timothy enjoyed life’s simple pleasures. He loved fishing, hunting, and taking long rides on his moped or golf cart. A true car enthusiast, he could often be found admiring or talking about his favorite vehicles.

Timothy’s legacy of love continues through those who will forever cherish his memory: his devoted children, Timothy James Smith, Jr., Tia Marie Smith, Damon Ezekiel Smith (Shanta), and Damontre Laquon Smith; his loving mother, Elder Elouise B. Smith; and his precious grandchildren, Imarri, Qaysuan, and King Moultrie, Shonterria, Damon Jr., and De'Moni Smith. He is also remembered with deep affection by his siblings, Minister Matthew Smith (Patricia), Elder Sheila Pinckney, Annie Dozier (Dennis), Minister Georgianne Edwards and Viola Green (Emuel); special aunt and uncle, Ruth and John Stevens; and a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.
