Robert C. “Bob” Struble, 93, of Chamberlain, SD, passed away on October 24, 2022 at Sanford Care Center in Chamberlain, SD.

Robert C. Struble was born February 22, 1929 in Phillip, SD to Clair and Margaret (Vogelgesang) Struble. He attended school in Rapid City, SD.

He proudly served in the U.S. Navy from 1948 to 1952 and was onboard the USS Gurke, one of the “Sitting Ducks” during the Inchon Invasion in the Korean War. After his discharge, he returned to Rapid City where Bob met Darlene Reimer and the two were united in marriage on February 7, 1954.

In 1954, they made their home on a farm south of Red Lake in Brule County where they resided until moving to Chamberlain in 2020.
