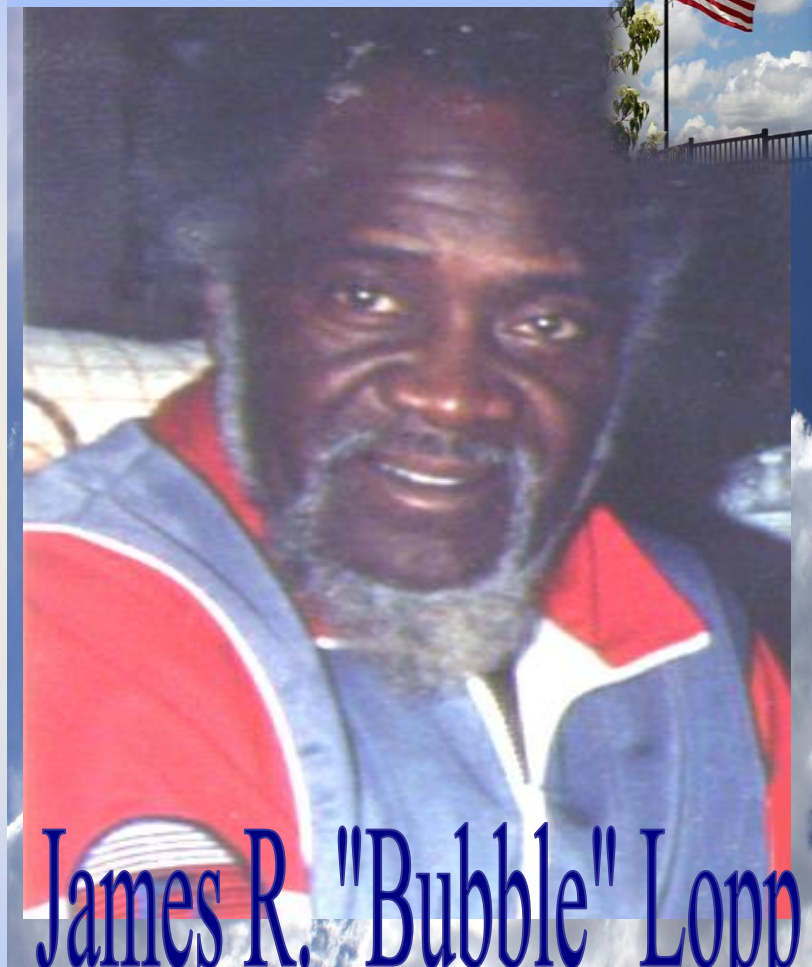

## Obituary

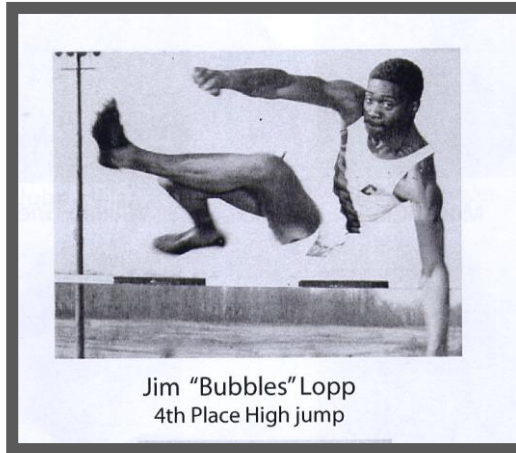


James R. Lopp, born on February 24, 1934 in Thomasville, North Carolina. He was the son of the late Eugene Lopp, Sr. and Sarah S. Richardson Lopp. He was affectionately known as “Bubble Lopp” by his family and friends.

His family of four sisters and one brother moved to Coatesville in 1945. He received his early education in the Coatesville area public schools. He began his athletic career at James Adams School.

At Coatesville high school, James played varsity basketball for three years. In his sophomore year he averaged 4.2 points per game as his team finished the season with a 17–5 record. As a junior, the team’s record was 23–4, as he contributed an average of 15.3 points per game. In his senior year, team went all the way to the finals of the State Championship, losing to Farrell High School. Led by an incredible 20.1 scoring average by Bubble Lopp, the team amassed a record of 24–3. He held the record of team leading scorer until it was broken by Hubie Marshall. Among the highlights of his high school career is a 40 point performance against Bridgeport and also being a member of the Eastern Championship basketball team of 1952. This team also one the Chest Mont District I and was runner up in the PIAA State title.

Bubble played in the semi pro basketball league in Connecticut and associated with the likes of Wilt Chamberlain, Bill Russell and Connie Hawkins.

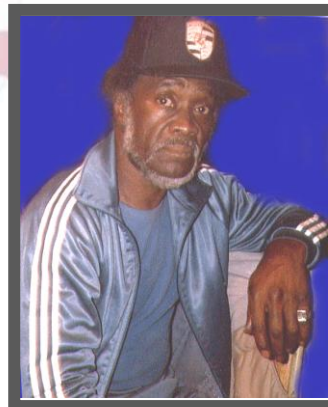

His athletic abilities also shined at track and field, where he was a member of the PIAA State Championship team. He ran on the hurdle relay team, was a long jumper, and was the State Champion in the high jump with a leap of 62 inches.

A three sport athlete, he also played tight end on the varsity football team.

After graduation from high school in 1953, James served his country as a member of the US Air Force until he was honorably discharged in 1956. On returning home, he was employed by Lukens Steel Company. James was currently employed for 10 years with the City of Coatesville’s Public Works Department where he worked as a Park Attendant.



He was a member of the Elks Lodge #151 and the VFW 2404 in Coatesville. He was inducted into the Coatesville Hall of Fame in 2002.
