Oscar Henington Brown Sr. was born on March 5th, 1943, in Chicago IL. He was the youngest of 3 children that blessed the union of Oscar Booker Brown and Ann Brown. Raised in the Morgan Park area of Chicago, IL, Oscar attended Shoop Elementary School and Morgan Park High School. Oscar's love for learning encouraged his continuing education at DePaul University where he earned a bachelor's and master's degree in Business Administration.

At an early age he accepted Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Oscar attended Arnette Chapel AME in Morgan Park, and First Baptist Church of University Park, IL where he was an Usher for many years, and he grew in his faith and the love of Jesus Christ.

Oscar went on to serve four years a Security Police Officer in the United States Air Force and was honorably discharged on August 10, 1968.

April 5th, 1967, Oscar married Janet Brown, who preceeded him in death, and they began a life together filled with love, and commitment that spanned more than 30 years. They were excited to raise a family and Oscar built furniture to help fill his home, and toys for his children enjoyment. Oscar and Janet became the proud parents of two sons Oscar H. Oscar began a career in the Claims Department of the Social Security Administration and retired having served 26 years as a dedicated employee, and four years in the Military, which equaled over thirty years of Federal Service.
