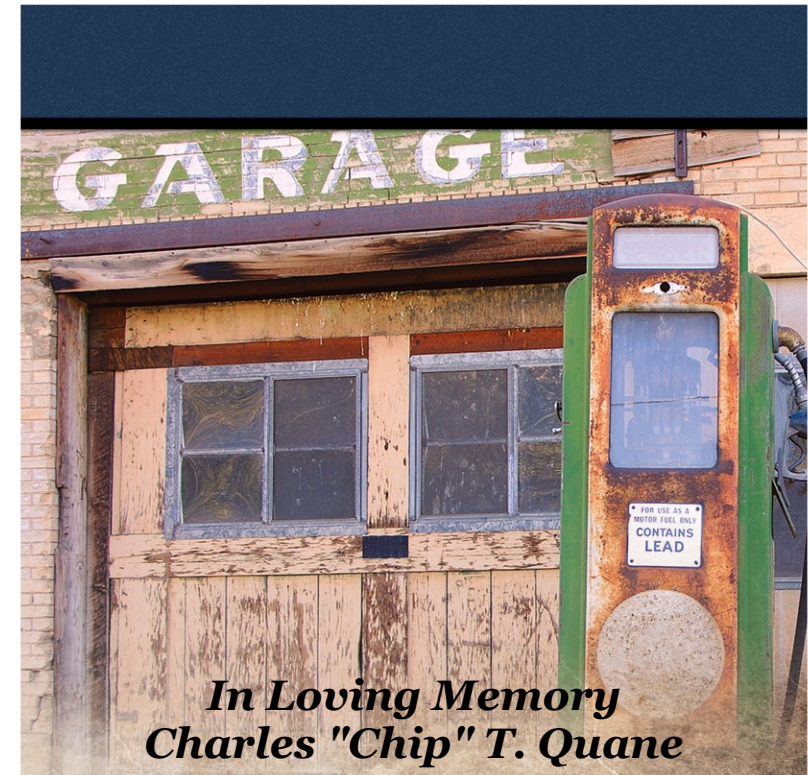

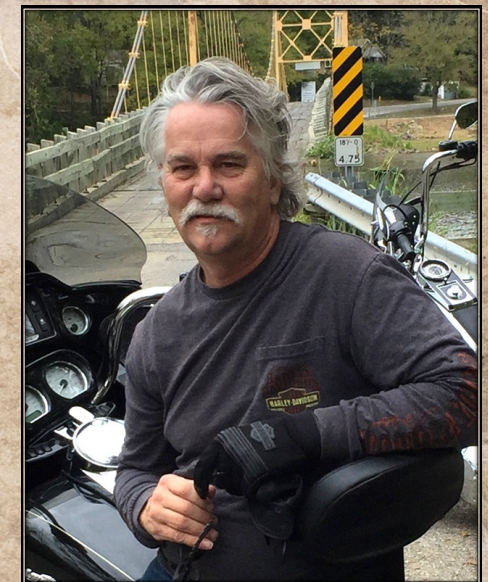

Charles "Chip" T. Quane, 65, of Wichita, KS, and formerly of McPherson County, KS, passed away on Wednesday, May 27, 2026, surrounded by his loving family at Ascension Via Christi-St. Francis RMC in Wichita.

Chip was born on July 16, 1960, in Libertyville, IL, to Edward Joseph and Elizabeth Anne (Braun) Quane. He graduated from Round Lake High School in Illinois before earning his bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. On August 14, 1982, he was united in marriage to his high school sweetheart, Dawn Kathleen Groves, at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Round Lake, IL. They were blessed with two children, Allison and Patrick.

Chip pursued a successful career in engineering and served as an Engineering Manager for Hospira in McPherson. Outside of work, he embraced life with enthusiasm and curiosity, especially through his many hobbies and passions.

Chip had a deep love for motorcycles and greatly enjoyed participating in the annual McPherson County Toy Run.
