Gary Bernell Wyatt (71), Born in Kansas City, Missouri, on January 30, 1954, to Bernell Wyatt and Dorothy Wyatt, Gary was the third of their ten children.

Gary attended Blessed Sacrament Catholic School and graduated from both Manuel Vocational Tech and Westport High School. This education led to his accomplished career as a Master Machinist and Master Pattern Maker with Fairbanks Morse Pump. He was among the best—only one percent of machinists ever complete the certification to become a Master Pattern Maker. Gary retired after over 40 years of dedicated service with Fairbanks.

He accepted Christ at an early age and was a member of Blessed Sacrament and St. Monica's Parish.

Gary loved and devoted his life to the well-being and care of his family. He was an amazing father, grandfather, brother, uncle, cousin, and friend to many. His hobbies included playing dominoes, bowling, basketball, chess, roller skating, and watching western movies.
