


Joe was preceded in death by his parents, Joseph and Shirley Coleman, his son, Mark Triplett, and his daughter, Kimley Spivey.

You left us peaceful memories. Your love is still our guide. And though we cannot see you, you're always at our side.


Our family chain is broken and nothing seems the same; but as God calls us one by one. The chain will link again.



