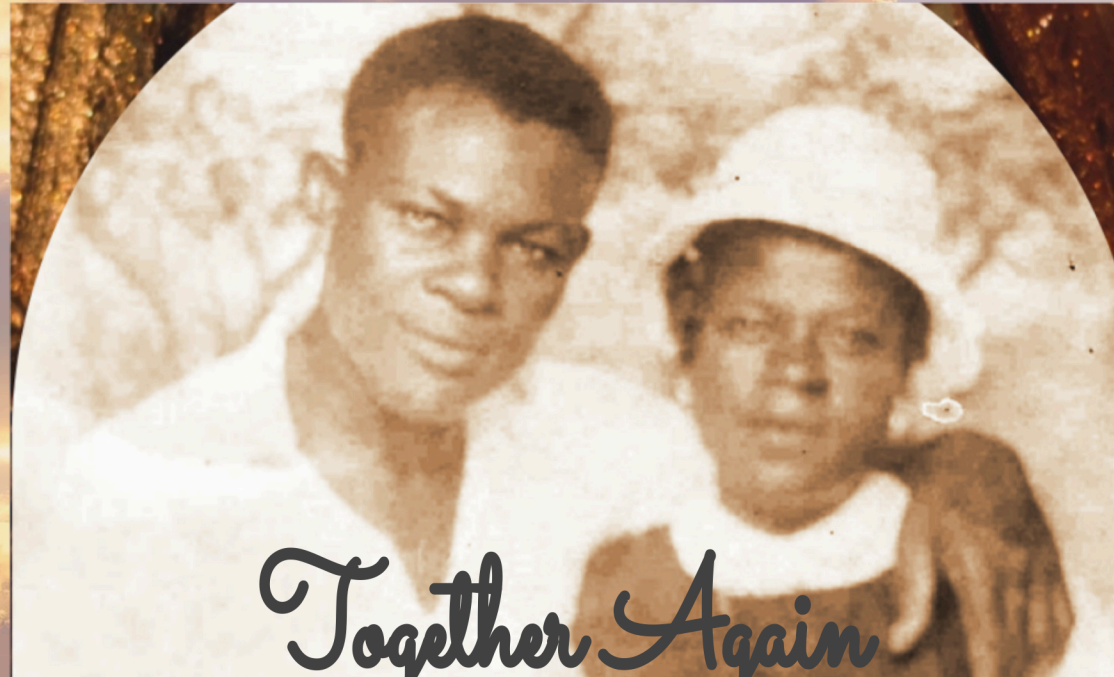

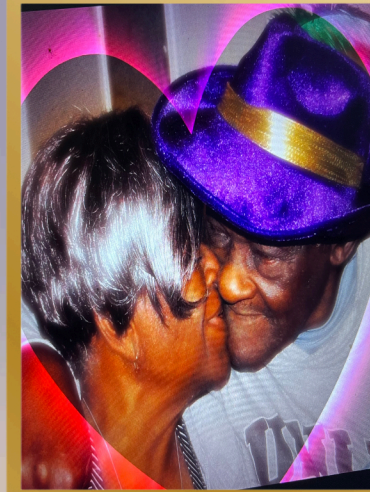
*If Roses Grow In Heaven*
