


Paul E. Mahlik

Paul E. Mahlik, 73, Luxemburg, died unexpectedly, early Monday morning, December 29, 2025, at his home with his family at his side. He was born in Green Bay, on May 30, 1952, to the late Paul F. and Helen C. (Johnson) Mahlik. On October 28, 1972, Paul married his high school sweetheart, Donna L. Jonet, at St. Kilian Church, New Franken.



Paul was a Luxemburg-Casco graduate of 1970. He served in the United States Army Reserves National Guard from 1970 to 1976. He was employed with Georgia Pacific East, as an electrician until his retirement in 2010.
