Bonnie Louise Moran was born December 8, 1944 to John Francis and Jean Elaine (Bauman) Moran.

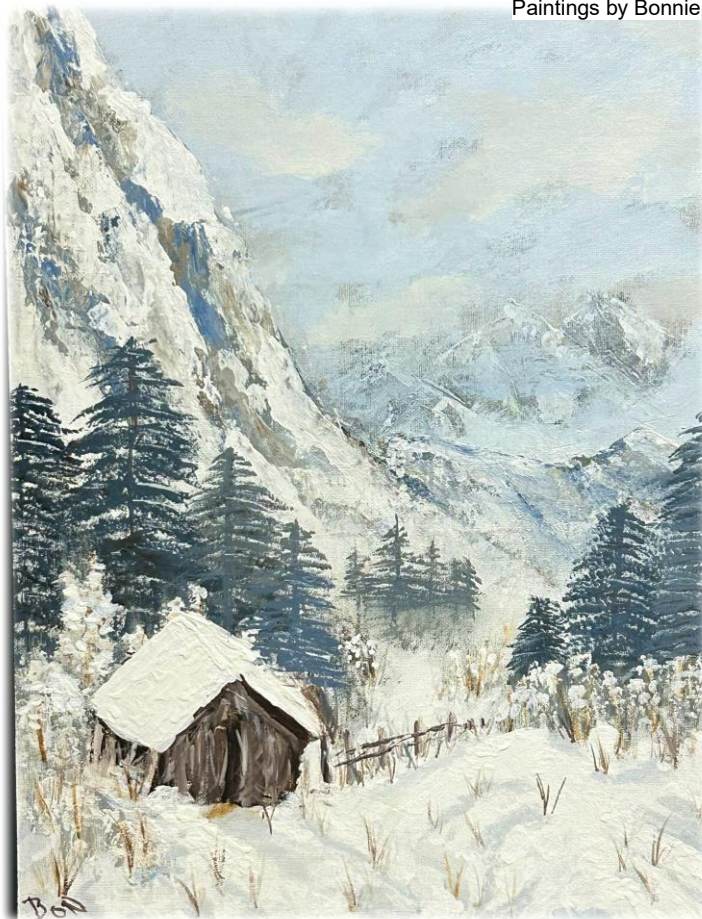
On February 20, 1965, Bonnie was united in marriage to Lyle Anthony "Tony" Schumacher.
