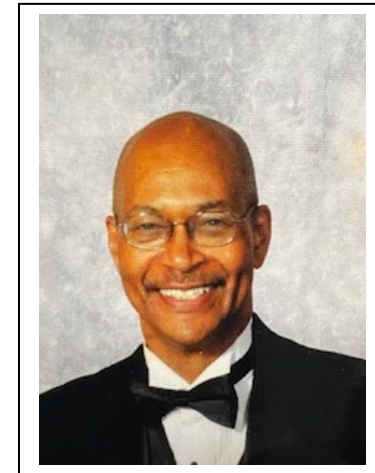

Obituary

Born March 24, 1951, to James and Imogene Bronson in Cincinnati, Ohio, Reginald (Reggie) was the middle of three children, including Maloy Bronson and Michelle Reed.

Reggie graduated from Walnut Hills High School in 1969. He married Linda Roberts on July 22, 2006, and they were together until his death on February 27, 2026 at the age of 74. Reggie was passionate about helping others, especially those recovering from drug and alcohol addiction. He became a licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor and worked at Talbert House, and UC Health for a number of years accumulating several certifications throughout the years.

He was baptized in 1988 and became a faithful and active member of the church of Christ. He participated in the Jail and Prison Ministry, C.A.S.A. (Christians Against Substance Abuse), and was the founder of Pathfinders, a support group for men and women in addiction recovery. He used this platform to give presentations to various churches in the Midwest, sharing his own story and encouraging those in addiction recovery. He was also a member of the Christian Jubilee Acapella Chorus, the Finance and Security Teams at Gray Road Church of Christ and loved to mentor young people. Always willing to listen and ask questions that made you think about your situation, he was just a phone call away and always an attentive listener to family, friends, and neighbors.

Reggie was preceded in death by his parents James and Imogene Bronson, and his daughter, Monica Bronson. He leaves behind to cherish his memory his wife, Linda Bronson, son Bernard Bronson, daughter-in-law Christa Bronson, grandchildren Braylon, Brice, Bria, and Jaiana, brother Maloy Bronson, sister Michelle Reed, two nieces, Amber Bronson and Ashley Smith, and three nephews, Craig Reed, Jr., Marcus Reed, and Brian Reed, as well as one step-daughter Taylor Roberts.
