Margaret A. "Margie" Lychwick, 80, passed away peacefully on Wednesday March 11, 2026, at Silverstone Memory Care in Appleton.

For many years, Margie served as one of the lead negotiators for the L-C/WEA Teachers Union, always standing up for her colleagues and community.

Outside of her career, Margie embraced life's simple joys. She loved embroidery, sewing, and crafting. She especially enjoyed gambling trips to Las Vegas with friends and family. Summers were often spent swimming and sunbathing by her pool, and quiet evenings frequently included watching movies, especially her favorite Hallmark films. She was also a loyal fan of the Green Bay Packers. More than anything, Margie treasured time spent with her family. Her greatest pride and happiness came from being with her grandchildren and sharing in their lives. She also had a special place in her heart for her beloved basset hound, Daisy Mae, and her cat, Kramer. Margie will be remembered for her kindness, generosity, and her willingness to help anyone in need.
