Reflections of Her Life

Dr. Mary Ann Davis, was born Mary Ann Seay on April 1, 1939 in Excelsior Springs, Missouri to George Luther Seay and Carrie Emma Cowden. She was the second born of four from their love.

Dr. Davis was educated in the Kansas City public school system, where she would take the bus from Excelsior Springs to Lincoln High School, a historic school for African Americans. Upon graduating in June of 1957, she pursued her Nursing degree from University of Missouri-Kansas City. Later in life, she continued her education through Faith Bible College earning multiple doctoral degrees in Religious Education, Christian Business Administration With an Emphasis on Teaching and Research, Scriptural Psychology, Faith Based Counseling, Christian Counseling, and Theology.

In 1955, she was baptized in Jesus name and filled with the Holy Ghost at Leavenworth Pentecostal Church, in Leavenworth, Kansas. Dr. Davis was not only a member of the church but a voice in the choir where they would travel and minister in different districts and states. In early 1956 during a church service in Leavenworth is where her lifeline, Elder Judson Davis, Sr. would encounter her and pray to God for a woman just like her. On March 14, 1959, they would be united in holy matrimony and from this four children, Rebecca, Judson Jr., Keith, and Elizabeth.

Dr. Davis spent 35 plus years serving Greater Pentecostal Temple through many lenses; Altar Workers Ministry, Young People's Ministry, the receiving room, Sunday school, Kitchen Ministry, Willing Workers Ministry, finance department, but mainly she was the church administrator; making sure all things operations were completed.

Dr. Mary Ann Davis, completed the Lord's work on Friday, May 23, 2025, where she returns to His embrace and the love of her husband of sixty-one years, Elder Judson Davis Sr.; her parents; her younger sister, Georgia, and brother-in-law, William Elliot: her son, Judson Jr.; and great-granddaughter, Mariah.
