The Obituary of Antonio (Tony) Roderick Bell

It is with deep pain and sadness that we acknowledge the death of our beloved Antonio Bell, age 51, who died in December of 2024. Known to family as Tony, he was the cherished youngest son of Albert Sr. (deceased) and Aslean Bell, as well as the brother of Renee and Albert Jr.
