Daisy Mae Hucks, born on December 8, 1942, in Hopkins, South Carolina, was the beloved daughter of the late Vandy and Francena-Morris Williams. She transitioned to her heavenly home at the age of 83 on Wednesday, July 8, 2026. Daisy was educated in the public schools of Eastover and Hopkins and was a graduate of Hopkins High School, class of 1963. She was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, and loving friend to many.

Daisy was a member of St. Phillips AME Church in her youth and in her adulthood became a member of both Second Nazareth Baptist Church and Greenview First Baptist Church.

Daisy worked as a Teacher’s Assistant at V.V. Reid Nursery and Kindergarten, under the directorship of Mrs. Ruth C. Simons.
