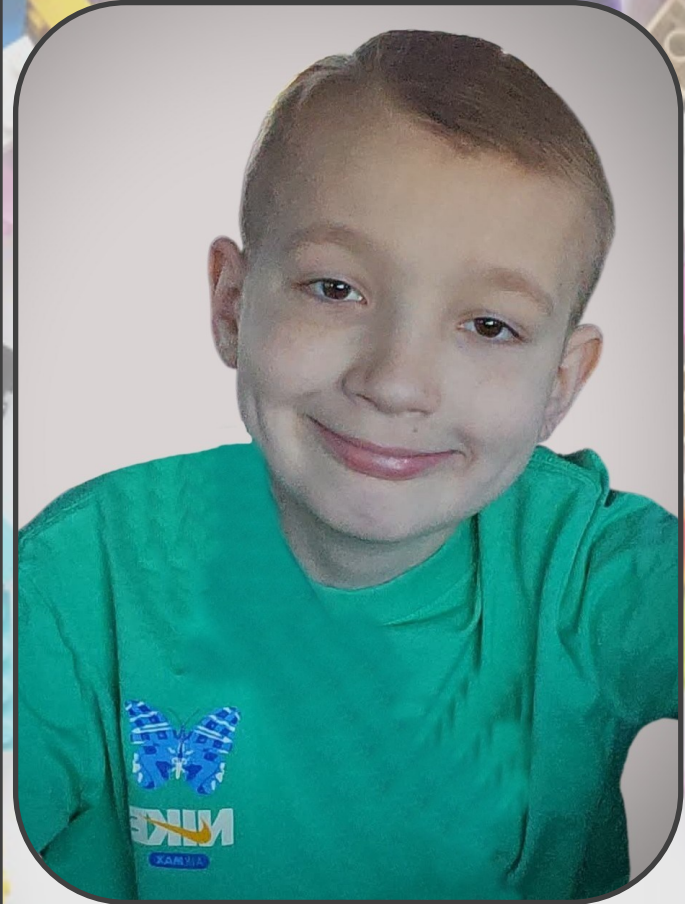

Jace Jamison Zembsch, age 12, of Whiteman Air Force Base in Knob Noster, Missouri, passed away peacefully at home on Tuesday, February 24, 2026, surrounded by his loving family. He was born on September 23, 2013, in Springfield, Missouri, the son of Derek and Brooklynn Zembsch, who survive in the home.

Because of his father's Air Force career, Jace had the unique experience of calling several places home.
