

Parley Leland Roundy, age 81, passed away peacefully at his home in Marysvale, on May 4, 2025, surrounded by his family. He was born on September 7, 1943, in Delta, Utah to parents, George Ervin and Erma Steele Roundy. Parley was everybody's hero, but his most important titles were those of husband, father, papa, and friend.

Parley joined the U.S. Army in 1963 and was then sent to Germany where he served as an artillery radar operator. He earned a degree at Steven-Henneger Collage and worked with computers at the Tooele Army Depot. Parley was a master at any craft, a brick mason for most of his life and he worked at the U of U campus for 14 years as their carpentry shop foreman. He married the love of his life, Carol Elora Lott, in December of 1971, and they recently celebrated their 54th wedding anniversary.

For years, he served as the president of the Utah Pheasant Society while living in South Jordan and for 15 years oversaw the UTV/ATV rides for the Paiute County Jamboree. While raising their young family, they vacationed in the great outdoors with big family get-togethers during the various annual hunts and 4-wheeling trips on the trails of Paiute county where Parley and Carol built their dream home from the ground up.
