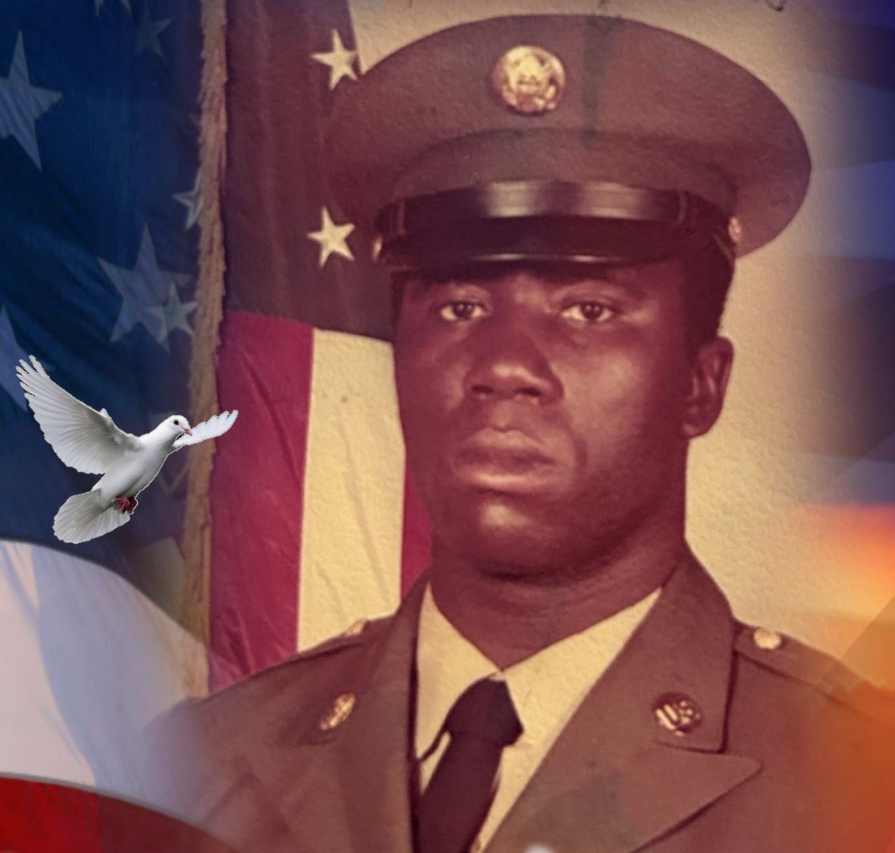

Coleman Williams Jr., affectionately known as "Sam" by family and "Vick" by classmates and childhood friends, was born on Jan. 25, 1954, to Coleman and Angie Williams.
