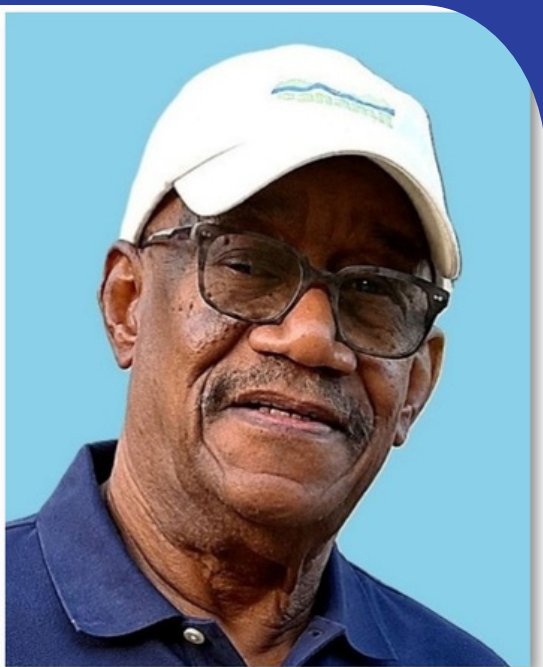

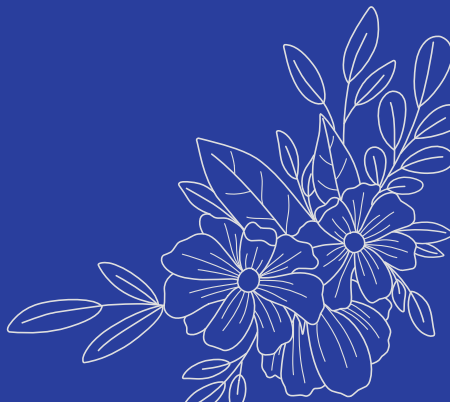

THE OBITUARY

Errol Clifton Marquis, 85, passed away peacefully on June 4, 2026, after a brief illness.

Errol Marquis was born on February 14, 1941, to the late Bernard Oliver Marquis, Sr. and Maria Cecile Deterville Marquis in San Nicolas, Aruba. He attended grammar school there and left with his family in 1954 for Brooklyn, NY to pursue secondary education in the U.S.

In Brooklyn, he graduated from St. Augustine High School where he was a varsity athlete in track and participated in foreign language clubs and baseball teams. After graduation, he served in the US Navy aboard the USS Essex, was honorably discharged in 1964. He later earned a B.A. degree from St. Francis College (NY).

In 1972, Errol began his career as a pharmaceutical sales representative for Eli Lilly and Company. During his career, he earned several President's Club awards for his clever negotiation skills and the increase in territory sales volume.

In 1975, Errol Marquis married the former Mary Hipp of White Plains, NY. From this union are two daughters, Marisa Marquis and Camille Marquis. Errol and his family enjoyed traveling, attending sporting events, concerts and plays and hosting barbeques for family and friends.

Errol played baseball in the Greenburgh Recreation senior leagues, coached Little League softball, and became a competitive league bowler. Errol was elected President of the United by Choice Bowling League (UBC) at Elmsford and White Plains Bowling Centers. He was a member of the Greenburgh Over 40 Baseball All-Star team and participated in National Bowling Tournaments. Errol proudly held a ring for a perfect 300 game.

He was predeceased by his parents and his siblings Merlin Marquis, Maria Aldith Baptiste, Joseph Macdonald Marquis and Fanny Talbot. In addition to his wife Mary, Errol Marquis is survived by his daughters Marisa Marquis and Camille Marquis (Errol Gingis), his siblings: Bernard Marquis, II (Glenda), Alphonso Marquis (Manuela), Eve Bedford, Kathlyn Berry (Reginald) and Juanita Marcelin, and in-laws: Charles Hipp, Carl Hipp (Susan), and Patricia Blackwell.
