The Journey

Trévon Markese Norman brought life to every room he entered with bold energy, a big heart, and an unmistakable sense of self. From the moment he arrived on October 23, 1999, in Clinton, Maryland, Trévon stood out not just for his style, but for his spirit. He was magnetic, driven, and never afraid to be exactly who he was. Though his journey ended too soon on March 20, 2025, the light he shared and the love he gave left a lasting imprint on everyone lucky enough to know him.

Trévon was baptized in the Roman Catholic faith at Holy Comforter Saint Cyprian Catholic Church in Washington, DC, where he received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation.

A proud graduate of Charles County Public Schools, Trévon earned his NCCER Electrical Level 1 certification upon graduating from North Point High School in 2017. He briefly attended the College of Southern Maryland before answering a greater calling in the trades. He found his purpose as an electrician pursuing the craft with focus, passion, and determination.

Trévon began his career at JE Richards in August 2017 as a residential trainee, accumulating over 2,700 hours through JE Richards and Power Solutions LLC. In November 2022, he proudly became a member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local Union #26. By July 2023, while working at Adcock's Systems LLC, he was accepted into the Inside Wireman Apprenticeship Program. He studied at the Lanham Training Facility, completing course work in DC and AC electrical theory, the National Electrical Code, conduit bending, wiring and circuitry, safety, and CPR/First Aid. Trévon had recently worked with Freestate Electric Construction Company and was employed with Moon Lighting Electrical Service Inc. at the time of his passing. He was well on his way to becoming a Journeyman, with plans to complete his apprenticeship in 2028.





