

Candace Rene Cartwright, cherished daughter, sister, wife, mother, and friend, departed this life on Saturday, December 14, 2024, in Baltimore, Maryland, at the age of 32. Though her time with us was short, Candace's life was filled with love, joy, and a legacy that will forever resonate in the hearts of all who knew her.

Born on April 24, 1992, in Salisbury, Maryland, to Marko and Joyce Burton, Candace's childhood was marked by laughter, music, and a deep desire to bring joy to those around her. Known affectionately as "Cootie," she was a spirited presence who loved to dance, play, and help out around the house—qualities that often made it seem she was "her Daddy's pick," a sentiment fondly remembered by her family.

A 2010 graduate of Pocomoke High School, where she excelled as a scholar, Candace pursued her passion for business and earned a bachelor's degree in business administration and management from Bowie State University in 2014.
