valley of the shadow of death.



Margaret Rosella Kressin, lovingly known as Margie, passed away on September 12, 2025. Born on November 5, 1939, to Henry and Margaret (Muellenbach) Sikorski, Margie was baptized on November 12, 1939, at St. Anthony's Church in Fairmount, beginning a life rooted in faith.

Margie graduated from Campbell High School in 1957 and married Allan Kressin, on February 11, 1961. Together, they had two children, Lynn and Linda.

Margie devoted her career to caring for others in many meaningful ways. She began as a nurse assistant at St. Francis Hospital and then worked at Dr. Pfister's Dental Office.
