Go to the friends we know

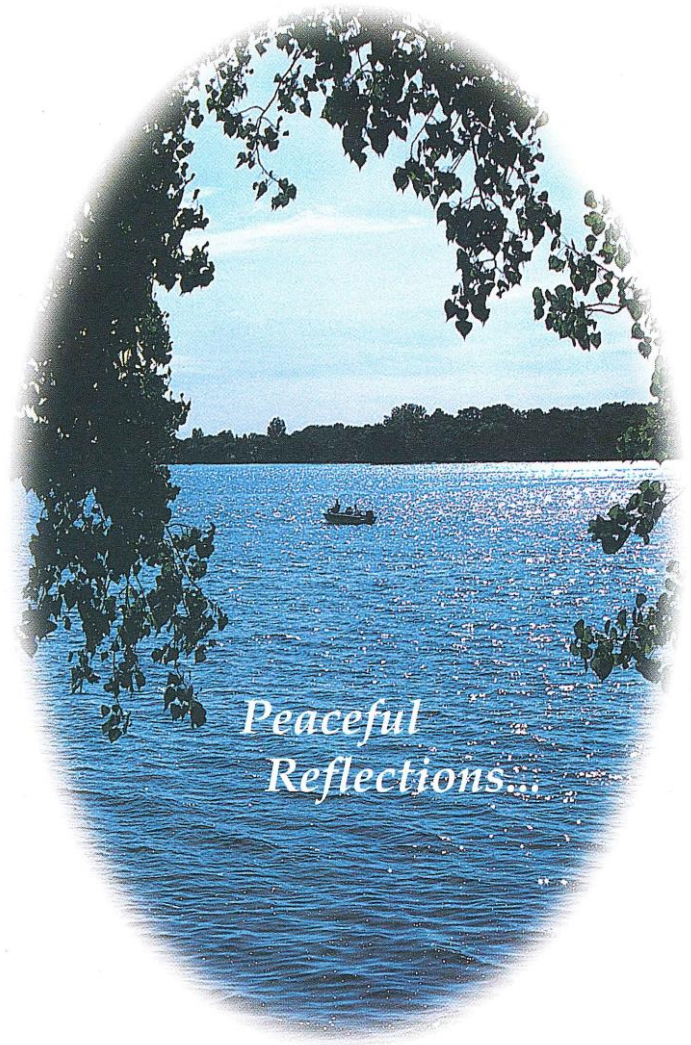
And bury your sorrows in doing good deeds-
