These moments meant so much to me*

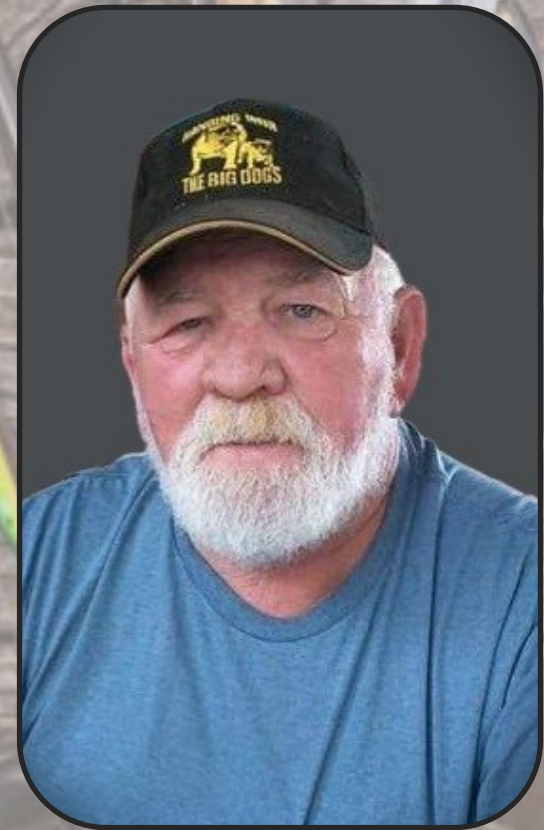
*When peace from nature all around
