A proud Roxbury native, Kim grew up primarily in Boston while also spending meaningful parts of her life traveling to Mississippi each year. With roots deeply planted in both places, she carried a blend of northern resilience and southern warmth that shaped the woman so many came to adore.

Kim inherited her love for sports from her mother, Annie Lewis Jones, a talented athlete who played high school basketball, excelled in softball, and proudly competed in state championships. Following in her mother's footsteps, Kim became an accomplished athlete herself. Kim went to Jamaica Plain High and in her senior year led her team to the state championships. Sports were one of Kim's greatest passions—she loved football, but basketball was her sanctuary and her joy.

Outside of athletics, Kim's heart belonged to Blues and soul music. She treasured artists like the O'Jays, Marvin Sease, and Tyrone Davis. Some of her favorite songs included Betty Wright's classics *"No Pain, No Gain"* and *"One Monkey Don't Stop No Show"* by King George.
