the shadow of death, I will fear no evil:

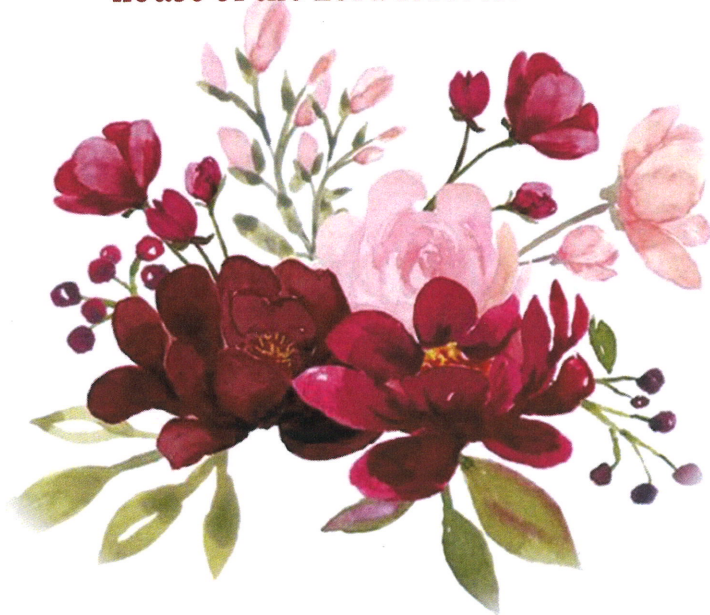
for thou art with me;
