After Glow

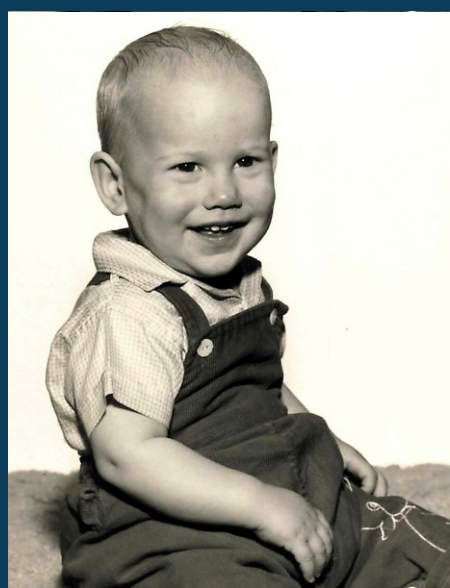
I'd like the memory of me
