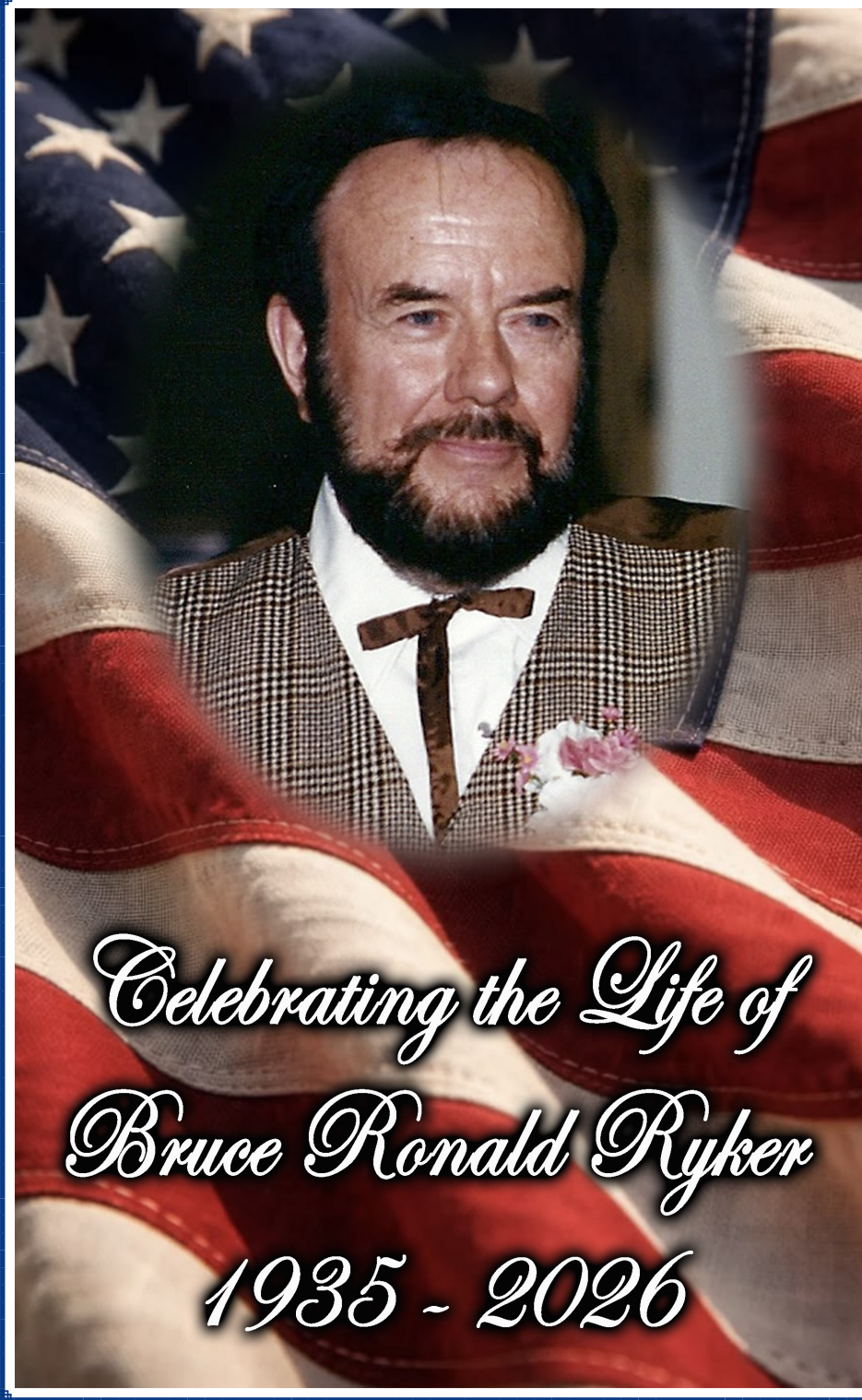

They were united in marriage on December 20, 1958, in Springfield, Missouri.

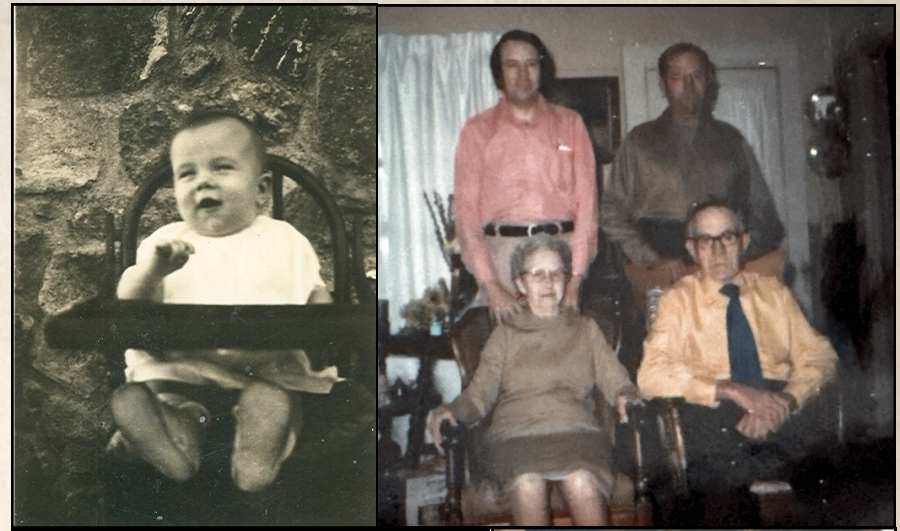
