

Chuck was born on March 9, 1948, to his parents, Charles Arnold and Reda Maxine Hutchins Houseman. He graduated from Amarillo High School in 1966. Shortly after high school, Chuck proudly served in the United States Army during the Vietnam War.

The two were married after just three short months on October 21, 1972, at Trinity United Methodist Church in Amarillo. They also enjoyed traveling, especially to Yellowstone, which they visited six times, as well as Glacier National Park and the Dakotas.

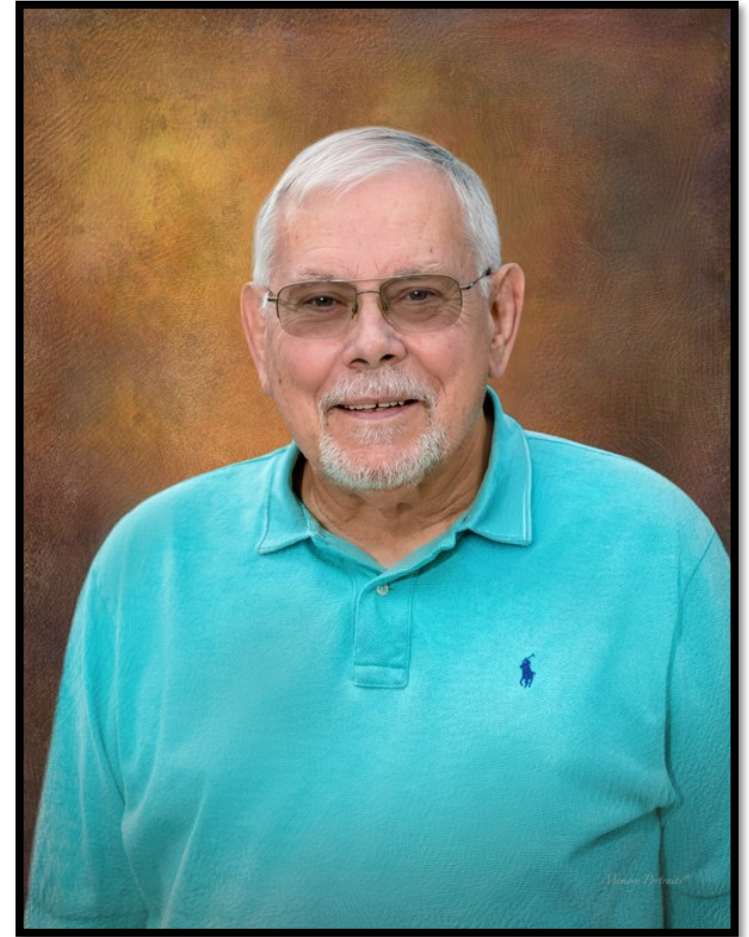
